SPMP gaining from European Social Fund

Poland is currently receiving a great injection of European Social Fund money, which is distributed within the framework of National Operational Programme Human Capital and funds are assigned to training people, improving personnel competence, and also to research and development.

The Polish Project Management Association has been involved in two huge projects: - the first project: "Support for companies to educate certified project managers", where SPMP is the Leader, has been a training project with the aim of popularizing project management among small and medium business and public administration and organizing training and IPMA Level-D certification for 600 people.

The project is now coming to an end (it started in January 2009 and will end in December 2010), and in this time of summing up we can say that it was a great achievement for our association, because we contributed to the increase of trained, well qualified and certified project managers in Poland. Training courses took place in many cities of Poland, hundreds of people were qualified in Project Management, the majority of them were granted IPMA-D certificate after a successful exam. They also got to know about the Polish association and our activities. Eventually, many of these people joined us as our new members, others started cooperating with us on different levels. SPMP also engaged its trainers who had been educated during two Train-the-Trainer courses which were organized together with GPM in 2009 and 2010. In September 2009 SPMP joined the Consortium of 7 biggest Polish universities and 3 Institutions, by signing a Partnership Agreement, and in May 2010 the project "Research project management and commercialization of research findings" has officially started. Its main aim is to qualify

over 400 people from R&D sector in research projects' management (especially projects financed within the 7th Framework Program) and in commercializing research findings. These goals are to be achieved through postgraduate studies, on-site visits in technology parks and clusters, and in different companies/factories, cooperating and communicating with entrepreneurship. Last but not least, the graduates will undergo IPMA Level-D certification, which is also included in the budget. Our long-term goal is to work out a competence model for Research & Development project manager, that will be based on IPMA certification competence requirements. The complexity of this project lies not only in the number of Partners that work together and number of people to be qualified but also the program

of studies. SPMP, together with the National Contact Point (KPK) play the crucial role here – our experts have created a program that combines ICB 3.0 elements with aspects of managing EU funded projects (such as: applying for EU funds, reporting, auditing, legal aspects, financing, marketing of research services). In order to support the program with specific, detailed and harmonized material for lecturers and trainers, SPMP's trainers and National Contact Point's experts gathered on 20-21.09.2010 to have a workshop that focused on creating case study of a research project. Our organization has achieved results in theoretical and practical areas lately in the field of project controlling.

Our experts performed direct counseling tasks in connection with several construction industry investments (Construction of M31 and M43 motorways, Construction of Tisza bridge, railway reconstruction of Záhony area, construction of office buildings and halls, etc.). A major result in connection with the investment was that the excess of the expenses was observed and corrected in time, what is more we kept the planned gross margin. In the international market it is important mentioning that our team members are going to start project controlling activity at one of the Czech Republic's most considerable construction industry companies soon.



Based on the analysis of practical experience, we made considerable improvement in theoretical problems. We know how project controlling works

successfully in practice. Besides the importance of using the suitable software application, the root of the matter is in the choice of an adequate methodology and management of project controlling processes led by competent experts. An adequate synergy has to be built by the project controller between the project manager and the management of the construction industry. Our practical experience is published in several ways by our colleagues and we provide education to the participants of the building industry.

14th International Congress on Project Engineering and 1st Latin American Conference on Project Engineering

The 14th International Congress on Project Engineering and 1st Latin American Conference on Project Engineering was held in Madrid from 30th June to 2nd July and was organized by AEIPRO, IPMA and Universidad Politécnica de Madrid. This forum got together professionals linked to engineering projects and professors involved in training of future engineers.

Inaugural session: The Engineering Essence

“Projects are the engineering essence in which they play a decisive role”, explained Javier Uceda, UPM rector, in the Congress inauguration. “With the time, projects change”, he added “absorbing new formulas, technologies and factors such as the increment of environment and security awareness, that have been incorporated to the essential lines of project complexity, where we can also found the macro, micro and nano size”.

The European Space for Higher Education has proportionate new elements to be taking into consideration in the business and academic fields, beyond European Union frontier. As a result of this, the congress has given rooms for active participation of those who are responsible in the Latin America’s educational and business scopes.

In this remark, as one of the important aspects, the growth of institutional relationship between AEIPRO (Asociación Española de Ingeniería de Proyectos) and APOGEP (Associação Portuguesa de Gestao de Projectos), both affiliated to IPMA, is seen. Likewise peruvian and mexican associations, APDP (Asociación Peruana de Dirección de Proyectos) and AMDP (Asociación Mexicana de Dirección de Proyectos), newly created.

Projects to transform a city: Madrid

This is the slogan of the Congress, which served as common thread of all activities. It is a paradigmatic case of how groups of big projects are transforming the Spanish capital: IFEMA, METROSUR, the M-30, the Río Project, the Olympic facilities, etc. These examples perfectly show the role that a well-conceived, developed and executed project can achieve in the development of a city. Also, the consideration of social aspects in all this process will have a special mention.

The Congress objective is to stimulate the participation of specialists, who develop and realize their activities in industries, administrations, universities or investigation centers, both in European and Latin American countries. This is to say that their business initiatives, project investigations, experiences and contributions, will really enrich the world, in the area of project engineering.

Scientific Program

The Congress Scientific Program based their activities on the presentation of communications in the main work area of Project Engineering.

850 authors from 14 countries: Spain, Brazil, Chile, Colombia, Mexico, Honduras, Peru, Venezuela, Cuba, France, Italy, Portugal, Slovakia and Uzbekistan.

Moreover, newly thematic workshops have been included:

- Educational Innovation on engineering projects: Bologna and adaptation processes to Latin America.
- Project Certification from IPMA and its worldwide role: New guidance and products.
- Publications on impact magazines: Comisión Nacional de Evaluación de la Actividad Investigadora, CNEAI.
- The incorporation of Work Safety and Health preventive aspects in engineering projects.

This last workshop was complemented by a trade fair of Work Safety and Health companies, held at the Congress centre, which kept exhibitors and parallel activities.

What's new from AFITEP? More and more seminars

On April 14th and May 19th AFITEP in partnership with ANACT (the French State Agency for the improvement of working conditions) organized a two-day Project Management Seminar in Paris: "Manage your project risks without stress".

Because uncertainty is inherent to the project concept each project brings change and involves risks with potential negative effects on the project. Such a seminar helps to have a clearer and shared vision of risks and to look at unexpected opportunities. So the attendees appreciated the various practical presentations, particularly those focused on often unknown aspects, such as behavioural and organisational risks.

On 25th May and 16th June: "Project Management Office, what is the added value?"

The Project Management Office concept has become widespread and includes different contents in various organisations. How to set up an efficient Project Office? What are the risks and benefits of a Project Office implementation? What tools to use?

How to further improve the Project Office functioning? A lot of questions, exchanges and answers between the attendees and the PMO experts invited to this seminar.

And the next one on 13th September: "Is project reporting an exercise of communication?"

It is obvious that without reporting there is no visibility whatever the nature or the size of a project.

But it is not enough to define indicators, to collect data, as relevant as they may be, to obtain reliable information and to have a true representation of a project. It is also important to communicate efficiently with the different stakeholders of the project...and it is not so easy to succeed. How to improve our communication potential in the project report is the challenge of this next seminar.

Attendees of these seminars suggested many other themes and we are working to define the themes of the next ones. To be continued...

Year 2010 has definitely been most challenging and evolutionary for the Polish Project Management Association (SPMP).

During the last six months SPMP expanded on 4 regions of Poland where new Regional Groups were founded, so now we are established in 11 regions all over Poland. The whole range of SPMP's membership services has been formed into a strategy, and the effects are already visible!

We are currently undergoing a revolutionary change of the website, with CRM in perspective.

On 2nd October 2010 the chairmen of SPMP Regional Groups came to meet SPMP Board in Warsaw to discuss the needs of our members, support that we can give to them and possible future directions. Sharing experience and exchanging ideas between the groups was the most important point of the meeting.

New Member Co. of FÖVOSZ:

The main functional area of **Mid-Pannon** is the regional development of the economy. We are the biggest background organization of the region in the area of economy development. Our mission and role is to maintain the sustainable development of the regional economy, to watch the current market circumstances and to carry out necessary intervention or to make suggestions to do that.

All of these are done by co-operating closely as a member of a regional network. It's members are enterprises, municipalities, European Union and state organizations, financial institutions, corporate- and professional authorities.

The form of the company is public

limited company, which has been working since 1996. The current capital is €6.3 Million, it has been increased by €4 Million since the foundation. On the top of the proprietary circle is a holding governed by the state (with a share of 90.8 %) This owner has been accompanied with the municipalities of the three county seats of the region. Considering our function, we have intermediary role between the public and the private sector. It was established under the Company Act of Hungary. The staff does not contain civil servants, we work with normal employees. We emphasise the development role and the moderate profit as well.

It is „governed by a law”, which means we are between the public and private sector, because the owner is a state

company 90,8%, and the 10 % rest is belong to the self-governing sector.

Our main activities are to finance the small and medium enterprises, to develop supporting the infrastructure. Our task is to support of technology oriented companies, joint development projects with municipalities, to develop clusters and international projects.

About the financing the small and medium enterprises it is true that there is no sector preference, but in this economic crisis situation it is important to concentrate on the main industrial sectors originated from the circumstances of the region. Forty-seven companies have received €4.1 Million funding since 1994. Currently the size of the portfolio is €3.1 Million in twenty-one companies.

On the field of infrastructure development we can say that we are the owner of one incubator house with size of 6000 square meters, and it has twenty-seven tenants.

With the help of the municipalities we intend to create 3 industrial parks and one incubator house.

Acquiring and preserving knowledge mean the pledge of operation for the small and medium enterprises. It is especially true in the global economic crisis. All of these mean:

- the core competencies have to be kept and reinforced
- based on it marketable products and services have to be given
- market/co-operating network have to be built

To support it our Company is working on establishing Innovation and Technology Centres, which concentrate on the intensive activities of knowledge and technologies, co-operating with the „spin-off companies” and other researching places. A small technology centre has been established together with the main Technical University of the region – 1000 sq. meters, 6 tech-oriented SMEs established on the basis of the university.

Our company has experiences on the field of international co-operation and project-observation as well. In this field our aim is to be involved and to involve our partners into the development of the regional economy

based on international experiences. In the INTERREG IIIC program we gained experiences about the innovation, reinforcing co-operation and managing the risk capital of small and medium enterprises. In the URBACT program we gained experiences in the field of urban development.

Those realized international project samples are very precious, which we could apply in the field of developing small and medium enterprises and regional development.

In the South-eastern-Europe program we concentrate on developing brown

field capital investments of former socialist industrial areas in bad financial and labour market situation and on forming and developing technological parks.

In the Prometheus project we work together with our international partners on developing utilization of renewing energy.

In our Central projects we are concerned clusterization and development of entrepreneurial co-operation.

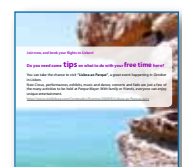
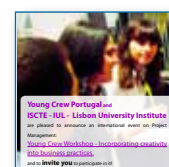
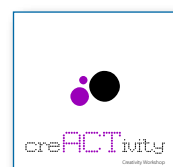


The first PMA Young Crew Event
